#### **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. CLEARLY MARK ENTRY TAG IF YOU ARE YOUTH (17 & UNDER) OR ADULT (18 & OVER).
- 2. EXHIBITORS ARE LIMITED TO ONE ENTRY IN EACH CLASS OF EACH DIVISION, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.
- 3. Exhibits will be judged by the Danish method, according to the standards of blue, red, and white ribbon classes. Only blue and red ribbon classes will receive points toward cash awards.
- 4. Open Class General Entry Forms may be secured at the fair office or from fair's website in advance of the fair. (<u>www.southwestwashingtonfair.net</u>) Entry Tags may be picked up at the fair office. The following rules should be observed:
  - a. A separate entry form must be used for each division.
  - b. All exhibits in the same division should be entered on the same form.
  - c. Entry forms and tags should be filled out before entering exhibits. No pre-entries or late entries.
  - d. The following information should be printed or typed clearly on each entry form and tag. Complete name and address, number of department, division and class, and name of exhibit.
- 5. Checkout time is 7:30 PM 9 PM Sunday or 9 AM 1 PM Monday after Fair.
- 6. No entry fee will be charged and no admission ticket will be given to any exhibitor.
- 7. Any article exhibited should not have been exhibited before at the Southwest Washington Fair. Exhibits must be entered in the name of the maker and made within the last 3 years, except canning which must be processed since last year's fair.
- 8. Special awards and Best in Class will be judges' choice.
- 9. Exhibits must meet the requirements for the Special Award to be eligible for consideration.



- 10. **Exhibits that are soiled or dirty will not receive a ribbon**. Clothing may have been worn if it is laundered or cleaned before being exhibited.
- 11. Judging of exhibits will take place Thursday, August 10th before the Fair.
- 12. Any foods that have been on open display must be discarded by the Superintendent for food safety reasons. They cannot be returned to the exhibitor. Canned goods will be returned.
- 13. \$1.00 will be given for the exhibit judged best in class.

#### **Special Award**

### Living Arts Person of the Year

A Superintendent's award of \$25 will be given to the person who enters 1 item in a minimum of 7 or maximum of 8 divisions. Only 1 item per division may be entered as a "LAP". Please enter articles as you usually would, but indicate on the exhibitors tag and entry form with bold print "LAP", (indicating the article is to be considered for the Living Arts Person of the Year), also inform check-in person. Points will be awarded based on each marked entries total premiums awarded, with 5 points additional for Best of Class on marked items. A drawing will be held in the case of a tie.

### **Best of Department**

The top 2 entries of each division will be awarded a prize and rosette ribbon.

#### Fair Theme

Articles representing the 2017 Fair Theme "I'm A Fair Kid!r" will be eligible for a special ribbon.

Enter articles as you usually would, but indicate on the exhibitors tag and entry form in bold print "FT", indicating the article is to be considered for Fair Theme Ribbon, also inform check-in person.

### Peoples' Choice

A "People's Choice" ribbon will be awarded daily to the quilt voted best entry. The visiting public will vote. No premiums are paid.

Any small, plain label on the top or bottom of the jar will be satisfactory (approx. 1"x 2"). If unable to obtain labels, the back of the Exhibitor's Tag may be used. Please attach to jar with rubber band. Remove string.

THE JUDGE MAINTAINS THE RIGHT TO DEEM A JAR "NON-JUDGEABLE" IF THE PROCESSING TIME & METHOD ARE NOT CLEARLY EVIDENT OR LISTED PROCESSING IS ACCORDING TO OUTDATED GUIDELINES.



Suggested entries: Canned fruit, jelly, jam, preserves, fruit butter, conserves, marmalade, pickles, relishes, vegetables, and meats.

All exhibits in this Division must be in clean standard jars. **A standard jar has a name imprinted on the jar**. Please be sure rings are removed. Must have been canned since last year's fair. Tattler reusable lids will be accepted.

Do not use paraffin. Quart, pint, and one-half pint jars will be allowed. Jars may be opened for tasting.


