REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Read animal science division regulations and all animal requirements, including Judging Contest, Herdsmanship, Fitting and Showing. Also read section for ribbon awards.
- B. All beef animals over one year of age must be dehorned or have caps over the horn tips.
- C. Cow-calf pairs must be of dam's natural birth. No adopted calves, no surrogate pairs. No embryo transplant pairs.
- D. Market steers will be shown first in type.
- E. All Junior Livestock Sale Steers pictures will be taken at 10:00 AM, Thursday. Exhibitors must be present and well dressed.
- F. One entry per class
- G. The same animal may not be exhibited in both 4-H and FFA. The same animal may be exhibited in open class shows only additionally to 4-H.
- H. No parent/leader/other person shall be allowed to groom/fit animals for show.
- I. In the case that a 4-H member has multiple animals in a championship class, he/she is permitted to have another 4-H member to show one of the animals in type class only.
- J. If a member exhibits a bull at SWW Fair and takes it to State Fair, said bull may not be altered before exhibiting at State Fair. Ruling per State Fair premium book. (See age limit of bulls in State Fair Premium book)
- K. Problem solving steps will be managed as follows: 1) 4-H Club Leader, 2) Department Supt., 3) Livestock Supt., 4) 4-H Program Leader.
