Oualifications:

- 1. Applicant must be an active member of a 4-H club/FFA chapter in Lewis Co.
- 2. Applicant must be entering or attending a school or post-secondary education (includes trade school) and must be enrolled within one year of receiving Scholarship
- 3. Applicant must have sold a market lamb, swine, goat or steer at Southwest Washington Fair Jr Livestock Sale 2 years
- 4. Applicant will be required to submit a letter of recommendation from a 4-H leader/FFA advisor or member of the livestock industry. (The letter may not be from a family member)
- 5. Letters of recommendation should be original and may arrive with the application or separately by mail. If mailed separately, postmark deadlines still apply
- 6. Applications will be judged on: a)Livestock participation/involvement b) leadership c) community service
- 7. Applications will be available the Lewis Co. Extension office, from a FFA advisor or on the SW Washington Fair Website
- Application must be postmarked by May 1st and mailed to the scholarship committee: SWJLS PO BOX 1635 CHEHALIS, WA 98532
- 9. The decision of the Scholarship Committee will be final.
- 10. Sale Committee has the right to change or amend the scholarship application annually
- 11. The scholarship recipients will be notified by June 1st and awarded at the Southwest Washington Fair Jr Livestock Sale. The recipients presence is expected, but not required
