# 2023 SOUTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR EXHIBITOR'S HANDBOOK

The Exhibitor's Handbook is the official operational standard of the Southwest Washington Fair and can be found on our website at: <http://southwestwashingtonfair.org/exhibits/entries/>. Listed within are: contact information for superintendents, conditions of exhibits, identification of responsible persons, general fair rules and policy, exhibit requirements, and listing of awards and prize.

## A QUICK GUIDE FOR FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS

*Q: Who can enter exhibits?*

A: Anyone may enter exhibits in the fair. There are no age or residency restrictions. You simply need to physically enter your exhibit(s) on your entry day(s) and pick up exhibit(s) on the release day. Check each department listing for details specific for that department. Please note that some departments are limited due to space and staffing.

*Q: How am I assigned an exhibitor number?*

A: Once you register in the online registration system, you will be auto-assigned an exhibitor number. It is important you record this information in a safe place. You **never** want to create a secondary registration (thereby receiving a second exhibitor number) since this will impact your ability to accumulate and qualify for premium payouts.

*Q: What does it cost to enter?*

A: Entry fees vary by department; see complete listing of **ENTRY FEES** listed on the previous page or within each department's section of this Handbook. Check each department listing for entry times. Fees are paid at the time of online entry using the Southwest Washington Fair online registration system (<http://southwestwashingtonfair.org/exhibits/entries/>).

*Q: Can I enter exhibits in more than one department?*

A: An individual item can only be entered in one department and most departments limit the number of entries from any one individual. Individuals are not, however, limited to the number of departments in which they may submit entries.

*Q: How far in advance must I enter an exhibit?*

A: Deadlines vary for individual departments. Although livestock deadlines are throughout the summer, most non-livestock exhibit deadlines are one to seven days before the start of the fair. Refer to individual department listings.

*Q: What types of prizes/awards can I win?*

A: The types of awards/prizes vary by department. Although some departments give nominal cash premiums and trophies, all departments award ribbons.

*Q: How are the exhibits judged?*

A: Exhibits are judged on their appearance, quality, color, and all other attributes normally associated with this type of exhibit. The judging is done by experienced judges, who are specialized in that particular field.

*Q: Whom do I call if I have questions?*

A: Most department listings include the name and telephone number of the Superintendent involved in that department. They would be happy to answer your questions. If you are unable to reach them, call the Southwest Washington Fair Office at 360-740-1495.

*Q: What do I do when I bring my exhibit to the fairgrounds?*

A: All exhibits should be taken to the appropriate building; at that point you will receive help from the "Department Superintendent". All buildings will be visibly marked. Prior to entry day, complete your entries using the Southwest Washington Fair online registration system (<http://southwestwashingtonfair.org/exhibits/entries/>). Please bring a copy of your confirmation e-mail with you on entry day.

*Q: I would like to volunteer at the fair, who do I contact?*

A: It takes hundreds of volunteers to put on a fair every year! Whether you have a specific area of interest or just want to help out any way that you can, call the Southwest Washington Fair Office at 360-740-1495. We will be delighted to match you with one of the areas in which we need help.

## GENERAL RULES

The Southwest Washington Fair is "the official county and district fair and agricultural fair" (RCW 36.90.040). It is the objective of the Fair to provide quality competition, and a diversified program. The Southwest Washington Fair encourages participation of competitive exhibits; however, when limitations of space, facilities, and time occur, priorities will be set according to: 1. Area residency, 2. Previous participation, 3. Quality and diversity of exhibit. The management reserves the final and absolute right to alter, interpret, or change the rules and regulations as may become necessary; also to determine all matters, questions, and differences that may arise in or out of an incident at the Fair without notification to the public. Management also reserves the right to remove any exhibitor not complying with Fair rules and policy. Exhibitors must follow direction from their Superintendent and Fair Management. NOTE: If you need special assistance with entering your projects please call the Fair Office at 360-740-1495.

## CAMPING

Southwest Washington Fair has three campgrounds available for camping: **Bridle Acres**, located at the west side of the fairgrounds along the railroad tracks, **Fair Meadows**, located at the north end of the fairgrounds behind the Horse Arena, and **Oak Grove**, which is at the south end of the fairgrounds. These are the only three locations where overnight camping is allowed. Reservations can be made by using the online booking system Rover Pass. <https://southwestwashingtonfair.org/general-info/camping/>

## LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Show rules and operations are established by each department. Fair management reminds animal exhibitors good showmanship includes public education, cooperation, and herdsmanship. The Fair's minimum health requirements are the same as the recommended minimum health requirements by the State Veterinarian. The Fair Veterinarian will have the final say on the animal's health, ability to be shown, and fairgrounds livestock health requirements. **NOTE: As of 2018, the Department of Agriculture no longer issues fairs a blanket permit for out-of-state exhibitor's use. As an out-of-state exhibitor, you or your veterinarian need to contact the Department of Agriculture for any permit number used on the certificate of veterinary inspections.** Per Department of Agriculture call 360-902-1878 M-F 8-5, after hours and weekends call 1-800-942-1035 or go to their web page at <http://fortress/agr/gov/apps/EntryPermits/>

- A. Identification of animals, breeds, farm, etc. is good for all.
- B. Cooperation with other exhibitors and superintendent.
- C. Good herdsmanship creates a pleasant, safe area to view. Public hours are 10 AM to 10 PM Tuesday through Thursday, 10 AM to 11 PM Friday & Saturday, and 10 AM to 7 PM Sunday.
- D. Honesty and fairness are a part of showmanship. Misrepresentation of ownership, animals, or other acts to discredit or give an advantage may result in forfeiture of entry fees, prizes, and premiums or expulsion from the Southwest Washington Fair.
- E. Because of crowded conditions and public viewing of animals, only animals being shown are allowed on the fairgrounds.
- F. The use of alcohol on the Fairgrounds is prohibited. Its use may result in forfeiture of all premiums and future exhibitor status.
- G. No dogs allowed in the barns.
- H. Entry deadlines will be strictly adhered to. No late entries will be accepted.
- I. No selling of animals allowed during the Fair unless prior arrangements have been made, i.e. commercial space. **NO "FOR SALE"** signs allowed on pens, stalls, or coops, etc.

## PREMIUMS

The Southwest Washington Fair will utilize a premium point system for open class, 4-H, and FFA. The amount listed after the prizes are the points awarded to that ribbon, while some departments pay straight premium dollar amounts based on results. The total premium points are divided into the premium dollars available to determine the pay-out per point. Over the past 10 years, pay-out has been between \$0.09 and \$0.24 per point. Premium checks will not be issued for premium winnings that are \$2.00 and under. Uncashed premium checks will be considered a donation to the Fair as of November 30<sup>th</sup> of the year awarded.

## EXHIBITOR ADMISSION AND PARKING TICKETS

### (OPEN CLASS ONLY)

1. A one-day exhibitor admission ticket will be provided to each open class animal exhibitor at no charge for each day their animal is on exhibition. A separate adult ticket may be purchased for youth exhibitors to have an adult chaperone for each day. Each livestock exhibitor will receive one parking pass for their trailer and towing vehicle. Discount exhibitor tickets are available for the exhibitor only. Admission and parking tickets are on sale at the Fair Office beginning August 1st. Admission, parking tickets and livestock parking permits can also be purchased at the Guest Services booth beginning the Thursday before Fair.
2. Individuals who have static, or still life, exhibits at the fair such as Hobbies & Crafts, Home Arts, Jr. and Sr. Art, Photography, Agriculture, Baled Hay, and Grange will receive one single day admission ticket available upon request and picked up at Guest Services Thurs – Sun between 10 am – 5pm **BEFORE** fair starts.
3. Exhibitor admission tickets cannot be purchased at the Fair gates. You must have a ticket with you to pass through the gate or pay regular Fair admission.
4. Exhibitor parking passes are sold in advance only at Guest Services. One livestock parking pass **per household** is available to each livestock exhibitor at no charge. This parking pass is only accepted in the livestock parking area. Additional livestock parking passes can be purchased.
5. No refunds or exchanges on tickets or passes.

## EXHIBITOR ADMISSION TICKETS

### (4-H AND FFA ONLY)

1. Youth Exhibitor tickets are available to youth involved in 4-H or FFA programs and who enter exhibits at the Fair. Still life exhibitors receive one admission ticket while livestock exhibitors receive one admission ticket for each day their animal is at the Fair.
2. Youth Exhibitor tickets are available to exhibitors from Department Superintendents at your Entry Day.
3. Youth Exhibitor tickets in excess of the free exhibitor tickets are available at \$2.00 per exhibitor per day. Youth Exhibitor parents pay \$5.00 per person per day.
4. You cannot purchase exhibitor tickets at the gate; they must be purchased at the Guest Services Booth, which will begin selling Youth Exhibitor tickets the Thursday before fair daily from 10 AM to 5 PM. You must have your exhibitor ticket with you to pass through the gate or pay regular Fair admission.
5. There are no refunds or exchanges on any tickets.

# AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION

### GENERAL RULES

#### ENTRIES:

1. Chapters must pre-register by July 18, using the link below. Space allocations will be based on District No. 3 chapters, chapters with past exhibit history, then new exhibits.
2. All exhibits must be entered using the Southwest Washington Fair online entry system <http://southwestwashingtonfair.org/exhibits/entries/ffa-entries/>. If any entry cannot be made via the online entry system, contact the department superintendent for assistance. Bring a copy of your confirmation e-mail(s) on entry day.
3. Exhibitors must be FFA Members and have instructor's permission. Instructors shall make arrangements with the Department Superintendent for supervision and care of students and projects. Any exhibitor who does not meet standards required by Fair Manager, FFA Superintendent or advisor may have his or her premiums withheld. Premium checks will not be issued for premium winnings that are \$2.00 and under.
4. Exhibits must correspond to type, kind and amount listed in premium book. An animal or article will not be allowed to compete for more than one premium or entered in more than one division, except as listed in the premium list. Any FFA exhibitor showing similar articles or animals in 4-H will not receive premiums for those entered in FFA.
5. Exhibits shall be displayed in the manner and location assigned by the FFA Superintendent or the designated advisor. This includes stall and exhibit cards, chapter identification, decorations, any part of display or materials to maintain display and awards won by the display. Premiums shall not be awarded if the exhibit is unworthy even though there is no competition.
6. Exhibits shall be entered on location the evening prior to opening day of Fair. Livestock exhibits must arrive by 8 PM to ensure veterinarian inspection. All exhibits are to remain in place until 7 PM Sunday except those animals required to leave and enter on Thursday and Friday (see market animal rules).

The Fair Management will use every precaution for the safe preservation of exhibits but will not assume liability for loss or damage.

#### LIVESTOCK

1. Cattle will not be admitted for exhibition unless they pass the Fair Veterinarian inspection, adheres to general rules and an FFA advisor indicated ownership for at least 4 months.
2. The Fair Veterinarian will be on grounds and in unloading area and livestock barns on Monday before Fair from 8 AM until 8 PM. It is their duty to refuse admission to any animal showing evidence of communicable disease. The Fair's minimum health requirements are the same as the recommended minimum health requirements by the State Veterinarian. The Fair Veterinarian will

have the final say on the animal's health, ability to be showed and fairgrounds livestock health requirements.

- a. Brucellosis – All female cattle must be blood tested (certificate in hand) or calfhooed vaccinated. All males over 6 months must be blood tested (certificate in hand).
  - b. Animal health treatment required while at the Fairgrounds shall be the sole obligation of the exhibitor. Any veterinarian of exhibitor's choice may be called.
  - c. Any animal showing evidence of communicable disease after having been admitted to the barns shall be removed at any time at the request of the Fair Veterinarian.
  - d. It shall be understood by the exhibitor that if at any time during the course of the Fair his or her animal seriously detracts from the overall aesthetic value of the department, the Officers of the Fair shall request the Fair Veterinarian to dismiss the animal belonging to exhibitor.
  - e. An exhibitor requesting the removal of an animal at any time during the Fair for health reasons must have animal examined by Fair Veterinarian and abide by his or her decision. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of premiums and exhibiting privileges in the future.
  - f. All sheep and goats must have scrapie tag.
3. Housing of animals will be under the direction of FFA Superintendent or their appointee. FFA animals will be housed by chapter in FFA areas unless barn is full.
  4. Livestock areas are officially open from 9 AM–until fair closes each day. The Fair Management will furnish bedding. All cattle are to be double tied.
  5. Livestock entries are limited to 2 per class with exception of market classes which adhere to market stock sale rules. Champion ribbons will be awarded if judge deems worthy (no additional premiums for champions).
  6. Fitting and Showing contests will be held before Type: Novice and Senior. Jackets and hard shoes required. Anyone showing before 1/1 of current year in 4-H or FFA the same species loses novice standing.
    - a. Grand Champion in each area of fitting and showing will be entered in a Master Showmanship Contest on Sunday Afternoon. (See Division SF for more details.)
  7. All FFA members exhibiting in open class competition must conform strictly to rules and regulations applicable to open exhibitors. This includes pre-entry and payment of entry fees. On pre-entry label DUAL ENTRY FFA MEMBER.
  8. FFA Superintendent or designated advisor may refuse exhibits of inferior quality.
  9. All classes of pens will be judged in pens and cannot be used in other classes for example, market and chapter herds.
  10. No dogs allowed in barns.
  11. No sleeping in barn unless approved by Superintendent.
  12. Cattle need to be double tied.
  13. Fitting & Showing is a requirement for each species exhibited.
